



STANDARD ITINERARY: ALPHONSE ISLAND, SEYCHELLES

October 2011 – May 2012

1ST SATURDAY:

*Meet & Greet at Mahe international airport with fast-track immigration
Guests taken to inter-island charter flight for approx. 2.00 pm flight to Alphonse Island
Guests are welcomed to Alphonse & shown to their private en-suite chalets
Guests meet the island and fishery management staff
Fishing equipment is taken by staff to be set up for first day's fishing
Guests enjoy drinks and 3 course dinner at the beach bar & restaurant*

SUNDAY TO FRIDAY:

*Wake up call at 6.00 am, cooked & continental breakfast between 6.00 and 6.45 am
Guest meet at the fishing centre, dressed for the flats, by 7.00 am
Guests transfer to St Francois on mothership (approx. 40 minutes)
Each 2 guests and their guide transfer into a skiff and head for the flats
Guests fish from 8.00 am until 4.00 pm with packed lunch on the skiff or the mothership
Skiff's head to mothership and mothership returns to Alphonse Atoll for 5.00 pm
Guests relax for an hour before gathering for drinks and 3 course dinner around 7.00 pm*

FINAL SATURDAY:

*Guests wake at leisure for cooked or continental breakfast at approximately 8.30 am
Guest may take a stroll/cycle ride around the island or a swim in the fresh water pool
3 course lunch served at the beach restaurant at approximately 12.00 pm
Inter-island charter flight arrives approx. 3.30 pm to take guests back to Mahe
Guests either continue on their Seychelles itinerary or leave Seychelles*
